Essay Topic:

"Portrayal of a Silesian-Polish Texan"

Eligible Participants: Texas students of any ethnicity, any faith, in Grade 12.

Awards:

\$1000 college scholarship each; for up to four winners.

Email entry with your complete name, address, email, phone number, name of school you attend, and high school counselor's name and email on a separate page to: committee@FLMFoundation.org. We will confirm receipt of your entry. IMPORTANT:

Do not write any personal identification on essay pages.



REQUIREMENTS

- Focus on one person of Silesian-Polish descent, living or deceased, who lived in Texas in the 1800s or 1900s. <u>Include his or her name in your title</u>.
- Compose an interesting and original paper about this person to make him/her "come alive."
 Entries must be original and not submitted to any other scholarship contest.
- Interview a senior Silesian Texan in person or by phone for additional details about your person and <u>include name and date of interview in your citations</u>. This Interview is REQUIRED to enter your essay!
- Include biographical information, personality traits, career, and milestones about your subject.
- Type between 400-700 words double-spaced. Include the **word count** for your essay at the end. Essays with more than 700 words will be disqualified.
- List a <u>minimum of four references</u> with <u>at least one non-internet source</u>. References may include books, journal articles, newspapers, church certificates, and other documented sources. It is advisable to check your school or local library for books about Silesian Texans.Use proper English, grammar, punctuation, and spelling in a well organized paper. Submit the essay as an editable WORD document, not a PDF.

Ideas for Supporting Details:

- Note any activities connected to ethnicity, i.e., memberships in parish or organizations.
- Note if this person's home town in Texas is connected to a group of Silesian immigrants.
- Reflect any Polish traditions, language, or sayings of the person, if possible.
- Consider the person's challenges and contributions.
- Optional: You may submit one photo of the person in your entry. Do not include a photo of yourself.
